# Merton Neighbourhood Watch







### Merton is legally defined as a 'Smoke Control Area'?

#### Meaning:

You must not emit a substantial amount of smoke from a chimney – there should be hardly any smoke visible, and no grey or dark smoke.

You must only burn fuels authorised by Defra unless you're using an appliance on Defra's list of exempt appliances

You can be fined up to £1,000 if you burn unauthorised fuel without using an exempt appliance.

#### Facts:

Fires are not a cost-effective way to heat your home.

An Ecodesign wood burning stove can produce 450 times more toxic air pollution than gas central heating.

Burning wood and coal at home emits dangerous fine particular matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>), a known carcinogen – it can cause disease and exacerbate existing health conditions.

Avoiding burning wood or coal will help improve your own indoor air quality and your health.

Merton council discourage all forms of burning as it causes air pollution, can upset neighbours and can damage health, particularly of children, older people, and those with breathing and heart conditions. #### Snapshot of our achievements over the past year: Less Crime:

- Merton celebrated its lowest burglary levels in over a decade!
- Significant drops in neighbourhood crimes:
- Robbery: ↓19.6% Burglary: ↓12.3%
- Theft of motor vehicles: ↓26.4% • Theft from motor vehicles: \14.7%
- Vehicle interference: \\_13.1%
- Aggravated vehicle taking: 128.6%

However, there's a notable increase 27.5% in "Theft from Person." Do exercise caution with personal items in public areas.

#### **Building Trust:**

Recent shocking events involving certain MPS officers have underlined the need for our unwavering professionalism and integrity. With Commissioner Sir Mark Rowley at the helm, rooting out corruption and ensuring your trust in our service is a top priority. One such trustbuilding initiative was the improvement of public safety in Mitcham Town Centre through Operation Hambling, yielding substantial reductions in crime rates and antisocial behaviour.

Our collaboration with the Local Authority is proving impactful, particularly in enhancing safety in Mitcham Town Centre. Our commitment is simple: less crime, enhanced partnerships, and earning your trust.


# White Ribbon Day

### HAVE A SAFE AND HAPPY CHRISTMAS



#### Home security advice.

- Do you have presents under your Christmas tree?
- Can they be seen from a window?
- Don't give thieves an easy target.
- Keep windows and doors always secure.
- Keep presents and valuables out of sight.
- Dispose of all boxes and packaging carefully, particularly from expensive presents, and do not leave it on show outside the house.
- Security mark gifts and valuables with your postcode and house number.
- Register items using the free service: immobilise.com which enables police to identify the owner of valuables if they are stolen.

#### **Out shopping**

- If you are visiting the shops this Christmas, be careful how you leave your car.
- Do not leave valuables or shopping on display in your car.
- Close windows, sunroof, lock doors & activate security alarms when leaving your car.
- Park in a busy, well-lit area or secure car park if possible Visit http://www.parkmark.co.uk/for details of approved local car parks.
- Take valuables with you when you leave your car, eg: cash, credit cards, mobile phones, sat nav systems etc.
- Avoid going back to your car to leave your shopping part-way through your trip.
- If you have no choice, make sure valuables and shopping are locked in the boot; taking care no-one is watching you.
- Do not leave your bag unattended on your trolley whilst loading your car.

#### **Shopping online**

Choosing where you shop: If you are making a purchase from a website or person you don't know and trust, carry out some research first. Look online for reviews of the website or person you are buying from. If you are purchasing an item from an online marketplace, you can view the seller's feedback history before going ahead with the purchase. Payment method: Use a payment method that offers buyer protection, such as a credit card if you have one, as most major credit card providers will help you get your money back if the item is faulty or damaged, or if it never arrives.

Staying secure online: Use a strong, separate password for your email account. Criminals can use your email to access other online accounts, such as those you use for online shopping. You should also enable two-factor authentication (2FA), where possible, which gives your online account additional protection by double checking that you really are the person you claim to be, when logging in. ### Counter Terrorism Internet Referral Unit Public Reporting Tool

Members of the public can anonymously report any online content that they deem to be illegal or harmful, via the <u>Public Referral Tool</u>. This might consist of, but not be exclusive to, the following:

- Speeches or essays calling for racial or religious violence
- Videos of violence with messages in praise of terrorists
- Postings inciting people to commit acts of terrorism or violent extremism
- Messages intended to stir up hatred against any religious or ethnic group
- Bomb-making instructions
- Advice on how to obtain or make weapons
- Websites made by terrorist or extremist organisations

iREPORTit is a smartphone app (available on Apple and Play Store) designed to help the public across the UK to report their online concerns regarding the topic of terrorism. It was developed by Raven Science as part of the Mayor's Civic Innovation Challenge, in order to increase the number of public referrals to the CTIRU.

The design uses the smartphone's share button to allow users the ability to report content directly from their smartphone browser or apps on their phone, with minimal effort. As with the CTIRU Public Reporting Tool, is an anonymous form of reporting.

## Merton Stop and Search Group

Merton Stop & Search Monitoring Group is looking for volunteers to help with their work. This small group tries to help the Metropolitan Police ensure appropriate use of stop and search powers in Merton. This most sensitive power is used approximately 160 times a month in Merton. It's a key power to help keep Merton safe, but it also carries a risk of reducing trust in the police in our communities. The group meets once a month in the evenings at Wimbledon Police Station to look at overall data as well as records of individual searches.
